




Doane House Hospice has provided art therapy since 2001; in anticipatory grief and bereavement, this modality facilitates communication in an open, safe, and non-threatening environment. Our initial target audience was children but the program has since evolved to include the newly diagnosed, caregivers, and the bereaved. Our art has been exhibited around the community and is offered for sale. Please contact if you are interested in purchasing one of our many art pieces for your home or office.

This client shared her story beginning with her sole immigration to Canada. Now, she is a newly diagnosed client of Doane House Hospice, and her family is now here to support her.

Art Therapy at DHH

As a registered psychotherapist & professional art therapist, Anahita's expertise is instrumental in helping people use the language of art for communication. Especially in cases of trauma, people often find it difficult to express themselves during a challenging, emotional time. Instead of asking a specific question, you let the client share through images, shapes, and colours. It creates the conversation naturally, and makes a bridge to start the communication.



This teen was experiencing anticipatory grief. She created two worlds in her painting, connected by a bridge. The bridge depicts optimism.



Having been married for nearly 60 years, this caregiver was struggling with anticipatory grief at the impending loss of his wife. The art therapy was a great way for him to express himself because he was numb and speechless.

Anahita begins with an assessment of each individual's unique needs. She lets the inspiration come to the client organically, but sometimes she finds that some need more guidance (so she provides direction). During the art therapy process, she learns her client's motivation and goals, supporting them through subsequent sessions.

Anahita values the art therapy process as it helps individuals express their inner thoughts and feelings. She notices that during the sessions, people start to explore and understand their subconscious. This helps the client deal with their conscious feelings once they bring their repressed memories and feelings to the surface.

Visiting Volunteer Program

In clients' homes, Visiting Volunteers provide companionship, practical support and short-term relief for caregivers.

Visiting Volunteers help with day-to-day needs such as appointments, shopping and outings. Contact can be maintained through regular telephone calls. Clients are interviewed by our professional staff and matched with an appropriate volunteer.

Oasis Day Program

The Oasis Day Program provides a safe environment for social interaction and activities that illness can often restrict. Offered every Thursday at Doane House Hospice 10:00am—1:30pm.

Lunch is provided.

Art Therapy

Offers a different approach to traditional talk therapy, using art to help children, adolescents, and adults express thoughts and emotions they may not know how to express otherwise.

Caregiver Support

This program is open to anyone caring for a loved one living with a life-threatening illness. Trained volunteers facilitate this group once a week for one hour.

Bereavement Program

This program offers education and support for both family and friends coping with the loss or illness of a loved one. The program offers a variety of formats, including:



Anahita also shares how rewarding this work is, learning a lot from her clients: “I admire the way they look at the world around them, even when in a challenging part of their life. It always inspires me how those difficult moments can lead them to see more of the beauty of the world. Some of them become more relaxed and more mindful of the blessings and gifts they have in their life, like family and nature.”


